- 1.GPA in all completed "A-G" courses
- 2. Performance in courses beyond the minimum "A-G" requirements.
- 3. Number of and performance in UC-approved honors, AP, IB Higher Level and transferable college courses.
- 4. Eligibility in the Local Context (ELC) Identification of ranking in the top 9% of your high school class at the end of your junior year.
- 5. Quality of your senior-year type and number of academic courses in progress or planned.
- 6. Quality of your academic performance relative to the educational opportunities available in your high school.
- 7. Outstanding performance in one or more specific subject areas.
- 8. Outstanding work in one or more special projects in any academic field of study.
- 9. Improvement in academic performance as demonstrated by GPA and the quality of coursework completed or in progress.
- 10. Special talents, achievements, leadership experiences, & awards in a particular field, or other significant experiences/achievements that demonstrate the contribution to the intellectual vitality of a campus.
